Frequently Asked Questions

Beef Projects

- 117B: Beef Breeding – Sign up for this project if you have beef heifers, cows, or cow/calf pair that you would like to exhibit at the fair.
- 117BF: Beef Feeders – Sign up for this project if you have a beef feeder (heifer or steer) that you would like to exhibit at the fair.
- 117DF: Dairy Beef Feeders – This is also known as Dairy Market Feeders.
- 117M: Market Beef – Sign up for this project if you have Market Beef (Market Steer or Market Heifer).
- 117MDS: Market Dairy Steer – Sign up for this project if you have a Market Dairy Steer. This is not listed in the family guide but is an option for online enrollment.

Goat Projects

- 135BD: Breeding – Dairy Goats – These goats can be exhibited at the fair. If you have Alpine, Dairy Cross (cross between the dairy breeds listed), Lamancha, Nigerian Dwarfs, Nubian, Saanen, or Toggenburg you will sign up for this project.
- 135BM: Breeding – Meat Goats – These goats can be exhibited at the fair. If you have Production Meat does you will sign up for this project.
- 135F: Fiber Goats – Knox County Junior Fair does not have a class for this project.
- 135M: Market – Dairy, Meat, or Cross Goats – These goats can be exhibited at the fair.
- 135P: Pack Goats – If you want to show a goat in the Pack class you must sign up for this project.
- 135PY: Pygmy Goats – Pygmy does or wethers can be exhibited at the fair.
- 135C: Companion Goats – Knox County Junior Fair DOES NOT have a class for this project. We can treat this project as a miscellaneous project to be judged during miscellaneous judging at the end of June.

Rabbit Projects

- 225: Breeding Rabbit Project – This project can be exhibited at the fair. It must be a purebred buck or doe rabbit (no mixed breeds allowed). You do not have to be actively breeding this animal.
- 226: Market Rabbit Project – This project can be exhibited at the fair.
- 227: Pet Rabbit Project – This project is a miscellaneous project. It DOES NOT go to the fair. It is judged during miscellaneous judging at the end of June.

Poultry Projects

- 150CE: Chicken, Exhibition – This project can be exhibited at the fair. If you have fancy breed chickens, this is the project you should enroll in. You will have to exhibit 1 pen of three birds (one rooster and two hens) that are of the same breed.
- 150CM: Chicken, Market – This project can be exhibited at the fair. If you want to show broilers, this is the project you should enroll in. You will exhibit one pen of 3 broilers that are purchased from the Knox County Broiler Pool.
- 150CEP: Chicken, Egg Production: Hens and Pullets – This project can be exhibited at the fair. If you have laying pullets or hens at home, this is the project you should enroll in. You will exhibit 1 pen of 3 pullets that are the same breed and/or 1 pen of 3 hens that are the same breed.
- 150DE: Duck, Exhibition – This project can be exhibited at the fair. You will exhibit 1 pen of ducks (one drake and one hen) that are of the same breed.
- 150DM: Ducks, Market – Knox County Junior Fair does not have a class for this project.
- 150GE: Goose, Exhibition – This project can be exhibited at the fair. You will exhibit one goose.
- 150GM: Goose, Market – Knox County Junior Fair does not have a class for this project.
- 150TE: Turkey, Exhibition – Knox County Junior Fair does not have a class for this project.
- 150TM: Turkey, Market – This project can be exhibited at the fair. You will exhibit 1 turkey that is purchased from the Knox County Turkey Pool.
- 150H: Helmeted Guinea Fowl – Knox County Junior Fair does not have a class for this project.
